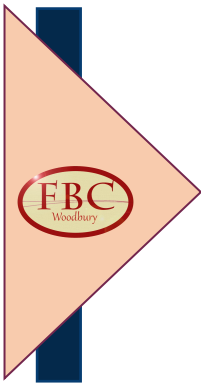




There is a fable about a devout, holy man who lived as a hermit in the North African desert. Day after day the agents of Satan tried to tempt him and draw him into sin, but their every attempt met with failure. There seemed to be little to tempt him with out there, and everything they tried met with failure as he faithfully resisted. Finally, one day in frustration Satan himself became personally involved: he stepped in and told all of the demons, “Your methods have been too crude for a man like this. Now just watch.” He then approached the holy man with great care, leaned over, and whispered in his ear, “They just made your brother bishop in Alexandria.” Almost instantly the man’s eyes tightened and a scowl crept across his whole face. Satan returned triumphantly, mission accomplished, and he told the demons, “Don’t forget what you just saw. Envy is often our best weapon against holiness.” In Psalm 73, the psalmist says, “My steps had nearly slipped. For I was envious of the boastful, when I saw the prosperity of the wicked.” What kept him from slipping? “I went into the sanctuary of God; Then I understood their end.” In John 21, Peter asks Jesus, “But Lord, what about this man?” Jesus responds, “...what is that to you? You follow Me.” When Satan trains his best weapon on you, head for the sanctuary and keep following Jesus.

This week in the morning service we come to Hebrews 3: 1 – 6, where the author urges us to “consider... Christ Jesus.” Keep your eyes on Jesus, don’t let your focus stray away from Him. In the evening service we’ll turn to James 2: 14 – 16 and discover three kinds of faith: dead, demonic, and dynamic. Only one of the three is saving faith! Be here – the Lord has a word for you!

DAY 1: Friends for Life

In August, Erin and Ellie were strangers. By October, they were best friends. That's what can happen when two college freshmen who have never met before get assigned a 250-square-foot dorm room in which to live. "We met the first day of college," Ellie said, "and I guess it was inevitable—we got really close really fast."

Erin Chapmond and Ellie Dunlevy are two of the more than 50,000 students at Purdue University in West Lafayette, Indiana. According to North American Mission Board missionary Jordan Adams, college campuses are the perfect places to plant churches.

"Students here live this incredibly interconnected way of life," Jordan said. "They eat together, live together, and go to class together. So when you introduce one of them to Jesus, multiple students hear about it, and the gospel spreads like crazy."

For Jordan and his wife, Jessamy, Purdue University is the latest stop on a decade-long collegiate church-planting journey. "We both caught the bug when we were students at Iowa State," Jordan shared. "We became part of a local church's college ministry called The Salt Company, and when we saw students there worshipping and sharing the gospel and being sent out, we really latched on to their dream of 'What if this could happen everywhere?'"

In 2023, Jordan, Jessamy, and a team of nearly 50 people moved to West Lafayette to plant a

church—The Chapel—and a Salt Company collegiate ministry. "We say, 'We brought a church to plant a church,'" Jessamy explained. "All these people moved here with us, and when we started meeting students, we found out they were radically open to the gospel."

"Radically open to the gospel" is not how Erin would have described herself when she first arrived at Purdue. "I was never into church, not until I met Ellie."

Ellie grew up as a missionary kid in Argentina, and unlike Erin, she was "very much into church." Shortly after Ellie started attending The Chapel a few weeks into her and Erin's freshman year, Erin asked whether she could tag along.

Erin's first time at The Chapel turned out to be more than she expected. "That Sunday, when Jordan started speaking, I felt like he was talking directly to me," she said. "I learned that Jesus was an actual person who loves me for who I am, even though everything was broken about me. It completely reinvented how I view myself."

"Now I'm a child of God."

Erin is one of 81 people The Chapel baptized in its first year. "We had pretty big dreams of what God would do when we came here," Jordan recalled. "But seeing what He's done with students like Erin and Ellie, seeing auditoriums overflow and all these students getting baptized—this has been way more than we could've ever imagined."
