



I sometimes think about something my mother said about my grandmother. During her growing up years and into adulthood, my mother always thought that my grandmother's favorite piece of chicken was... the back. That's the piece my grandmother always grabbed. She didn't draw any attention to it, she just grabbed it and smiled if anybody said anything about it. Finally one day, after seeing this all her life, my mother said it dawned on her why the back was her mother's favorite piece. She didn't like the back—nobody does. There's no meat on it. Nobody goes into KFC and orders backs; there are no Buffalo Wild Backs restaurants, are there? The way the chicken's cut, the back has virtually no meat on it. My grandmother grabbed the back so that everybody else could have the pieces with all meat and she just let everybody think that was what she really wanted, her favorite piece. That is the fried chicken application of "love one another." Romans 13: 8 says, "Owe no one anything except to love one another, for he who loves another has fulfilled the law." People who "put on the Lord Jesus Christ" (Romans 13: 14) look for ways to love each other, quietly put other people ahead of themselves, and pay a love debt to everybody they encounter, all without drawing any attention to it. Is that what your life looks like?

In the morning service this Sunday we'll turn to Hebrews 4: 1 – 11. Being saved, coming to know Jesus, is crucially important but it's the beginning of the story, not the end. Jesus didn't just call people to get saved and baptized; He called them to "follow Me." Hebrews 4 urges every Christian to press on and keep growing in Christ. Then on Sunday evening, in James 3: 13 – 18 we'll learn about two kinds of wisdom, and which one you should be living by. Now where else could be more important than the Lord's house, with His people, on His day?

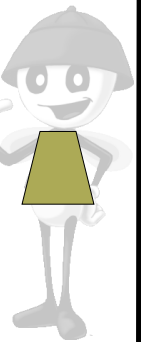

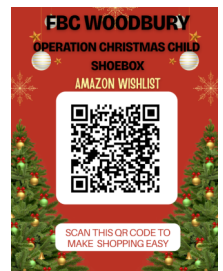

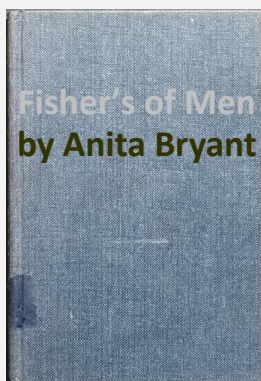

ANDREW MARK AND PETRA ADIL

DAY 4: From Beginning to End

"The beginning of the story is good. But the ending is even better."

That's Andrew Mark Adil's opening line when people ask how such an unlikely man ended up in such an unlikely place doing such an unlikely thing.

Born in the Middle East—"I was raised a strict Sunni Muslim"—he and his family emigrated to Canada, where a childhood friend introduced him to Jesus. "I'd never, ever been to a Christian church, not until he invited me," Andrew Mark said.

Years later, after returning to his home country, a place that was closed to most overt forms of Christian witness, Andrew Mark was discipled by International Mission Board missionaries, who "were the ones who really helped me understand the gospel."

He also met Petra, a Slovakian flight attendant. "At first," she remembered jokingly, "I thought he was a little crazy. Every time we had a date, we'd end up watching sermon videos."

Andrew Mark led Petra to Christ. They got married. And then they decided to return to Canada and plant a church in Montreal, one of the most unreached cities in North America where less than 1 percent of the population is evangelical.

That's the beginning of Andrew Mark's story. But, as he says, the ending is even better.

In 2023, Grace Church in Verdun, Quebec, sent Andrew Mark, Petra, and a team of 24 others to downtown Montreal to plant a new work. "Having a sending church and a core team around us was

huge," Andrew Mark said. "It meant we were able to hit the ground running."

For Andrew Mark and his brand-new church-plant evangelism team—"and when I say 'team,'" Andrew added, "I mean the whole church"—hitting the ground running meant setting up shop every Friday night, rain or shine, on a busy downtown Montreal street corner and striking up surprisingly deep and lengthy gospel conversations with passersby.

"We learned people here are genuinely curious," he shared. "Lots of our conversations weren't just, 'Here's a tract; have a nice day.' We were able to really go deep with all kinds of people."

Since immigrants make up nearly 25 percent of Montreal's population, Andrew Mark and his diverse core team were ideally suited for street evangelism there. "We met people from all over the world. That was perfect for us, because we had team members from the Middle East like me, we had Latinos, Slavs, Haitians, Africans—no matter what language people spoke, we always had someone who could share with them in their heart language."

"What's happened since then is nothing short of miraculous," he said. "Our new church, Christ Covenant Church, baptized ten people in one year, and we doubled in number after two years. In a hard place like Montreal, those things are unheard of. From the beginning until now, it's crazy how we ended up here. Only God can do such amazing things."



PRAYERPOINTS

PRAYING FOR MISSIONARIES

Every day, your missionaries work to impact lostness. They engage communities, proclaim the gospel, make disciples, train leaders, and partner with sending churches and churches overseas—all to advance the gospel and bring glory to God. As we steadfastly pray for the lost, let us also pray for our missionaries among them.

Through prayer and fasting, God breaks through discouragement in a Hungarian church

Our local pastor in Hungary longs for more healthy churches, but his congregation sits in hard spiritual soil. Attempts to reach the community yielded inconsistent results, leading to deep discouragement. When my husband and I joined the church, there was renewed energy and hope that God was answering the church's prayers for helpers. Excitement grew when six students accepted Christ at a summer camp. But that fall, only three young people remained in the youth group, and internal conflict caused others in the church to fall away. A spirit of discouragement again gripped the congregation. Members lamented how attempts to reach their community had not yielded much fruit. The internal church conflict also added to the distress. I suggested prayerwalking, but the idea met indifference. Then I shared a prayer request on [IMB.org/pray](https://www.imb.org/pray) so supporters in the United States could join us in praying for this church to have renewed passion to reengage

the community. Within a month, we saw an answer! The pastor announced a day of fasting and prayer. The church realized only God could bring spiritual and relational health, and only He could break through the hard spiritual ground in their community. During the church's seven-hour time of prayer and fasting, the youth group prayerwalked the community, using verses about Jesus' authority over demons. One student, fearful of local witches and the museum they operate to generate interest and sell their products, boldly prayed for the museum's closure. This taught them to pray God's Word. Simultaneously, repentance and reconciliation abounded as the church worshiped and prayed together. A woman apologized for her hurtful words, and the church embraced her with forgiveness. Believers understood they must reflect the love of God that they desire to share with the lost, beginning with their own spiritual and relational health through prayer and fasting. This day highlighted the power of partnership in praying to the God who hears and works mightily through prayer.

ANSWER TO YOUR PRAYER

Over 50% of IMB missionaries among South Asians have been on the field for under three years. Last year, we prayed for them to be rooted in Christ, strengthened in their calling, and faithful in language and culture learning. Thank you for praying. One couple experienced difficult changes on their team, lost loved ones, and welcomed new babies to their family. Praise God they learned the local language and have even become team leaders!

1 **IMB MISSIONARIES.** Pray God will call more laborers to the harvest field to plant churches and support existing work.

2 **AMERICAN PEOPLES.** Pray for a global missionary partner (GMP) couple working at the Casa Belen Refugee Center in Cúcuta, Colombia. Pray they will be effective in their ministry and efforts toward building the kingdom of God.

3 **SUB-SAHARAN AFRICAN PEOPLES.** Some missionary families have multiple schooling options for their kids, while others have one. Pray for parents to shepherd their children well and for missionary kids to thrive spiritually and academically.

4 **CENTRAL ASIAN PEOPLES.** "Our family recently started stateside assignment in the United States. Pray for us to rest well and engage with church partners. Ask God for more laborers to join us. Pray our four children will grow in their love for Jesus and have godly friends while we are here." *Mark and Rebekah Bishop*

5 **ASIAN PACIFIC RIM PEOPLES.** "Missionaries are often put on pedestals, but we are regular people. At times, we argue with our spouse, worry about our kids, and wake up wishing it were the weekend. Pray we abide in the Lord, receive His grace, remember His promises, and take up our cross daily." *Betsy Norris*

6 **NORTHERN AFRICAN AND MIDDLE EASTERN PEOPLES.** Two workers have been displaced but deeply desire to live among their people. Praise God for their hearts that are so willing to go where the Father leads and

desire that their people know the gospel. Pray the Father will give them wisdom as they make plans to relocate.

7 **EUROPEAN PEOPLES.** In some parts of Europe, missionaries are seeing greater openness to the gospel. Pray for bold, creative strategies to seize this unique opportunity, and for perseverance and great joy as they labor alongside local brothers and sisters for the work of the gospel.

8 **DEAF PEOPLES.** Pray for new global missionary partners (GMPs) to join IMB missionaries in the work of sharing the gospel with Deaf around the world. Help IMB missionaries to cast vision for them, support them, work alongside them, and invite GMPs into their teams.

9 **SOUTH ASIAN PEOPLES.** A missionary met animosity while praying through a remote valley with no access to the gospel. Years later, during a Send Relief project, several women heard the gospel. After follow-up visits, one believed, then her friend, then two more! Pray they'd read God's Word together.

10 **IMB MISSIONARIES.** Pray God will sustain missionaries, giving them endurance to minister cross-culturally.

11 **CENTRAL ASIAN PEOPLES.** Missionaries ministering to Central Asians labor and live in places of deep lostness. Many have had to relocate due to turmoil in their host countries. Pray they will find their peace, joy, and hope in the Lord. Ask Him to sustain them.

12 **EUROPEAN PEOPLES.** Missionaries in Europe are training their national partners to spread the gospel broadly and plant healthy churches. Pray for wisdom and discernment as they walk alongside these Christians. Ask God to use these trainings to reignite Europeans' hearts for kingdom work.

13 **NORTHERN AFRICAN AND MIDDLE EASTERN PEOPLES.** Even though Victoria had to evacuate from a war-torn city, she has continued her friendship with local women. Pray for Victoria to know the Spirit's guidance as she offers hope in Christ to those in need of hope. Pray that she will be able to see her dear friends again.

14 **ASIAN PACIFIC RIM PEOPLES.** Anthony, a global missionary partner (GMP), returned home due to his father's medical crisis. While others advised Anthony to care for his parents, his family blessed his return to the field, urging him not to worry. Pray for GMPs making sacrifices to serve.

15 **SUB-SAHARAN AFRICAN PEOPLES.** Before missionaries left Niger unexpectedly, they gathered Fulani believers from rural areas and cities, providing Bibles and audio recordings. New believers were baptized in the Niger River. Praise God! Pray for boldness and faithfulness despite persecution and difficulty.

16 **SOUTH ASIAN PEOPLES.** Praise God for sending many new missionaries to serve among South Asians. Team leaders are walking with them through culture shock and frustrations with language learning. Pray for new missionaries to endure these challenges and find opportunities to practice sharing the gospel.

17 DEAF PEOPLES. Pray for students who are serving on IMB teams among the Deaf during their spring semester. Thank the Lord for these students who are taking part in the work of bringing the gospel to Deaf communities around the world.

18 CENTRAL ASIAN PEOPLES. Allen and Ella Bristol are discipling the next generation of leaders in their church. Pray Allen engages young men to grow deeper in the Word and relationships. Pray Ella encourages their wives to be women of prayer. Pray for the gospel to spread in their community.

19 EUROPEAN PEOPLES. Europe is spiritually dark, and missionaries often face rejection and ridicule when sharing the gospel. Ask God to protect them. Though the enemy "comes only to steal and kill and destroy," thank God that in Jesus, we "may have life and have it abundantly" (John 10:10).

20 IMB MISSIONARIES. Pray God will give missionaries fruitful partnerships with U.S. churches and local believers on the mission field.

21 SUB-SAHARAN AFRICAN PEOPLES. Praise God that for years, missionaries in Niamey, Niger, shared, discipled, taught, and encouraged the Church. Most missionaries have left the area, but the Church remains. Pray for the body of Christ in Niamey to have boldness and wisdom as they continue faithfully serving.

22 ASIAN PACIFIC RIM PEOPLES. "Please pray for missionaries parenting teens in remote places. Ask God to give us creativity and energy in discipling our children while we strive to reach unengaged, unreached people groups (UUPGs) with the gospel." Katie Weeks

23 CENTRAL ASIAN PEOPLES. Many missionaries in Central Asia are planting new churches in areas where there are none. They work hard to disciple believers and train leaders. Pray for missionaries to love and serve their churches well. Ask God to grow churches in depth and in love for Jesus.

24 SOUTH ASIAN PEOPLES. As a global missionary partner (GMP) rented a room from a widow while studying language, she shared the gospel. Even after the GMP moved away, she continued to share, and the widow and her daughter professed faith! Praise God for missionaries proclaiming the gospel wherever they are.

25 NORTHERN AFRICAN AND MIDDLE EASTERN PEOPLES. Learning language and culture is crucial in having spiritual conversations. Pray for those who've newly arrived overseas to have ears to hear and minds to understand. Pray they will courageously enter the community, practice what they've learned, and make new friends.

26 EUROPEAN PEOPLES. Pray for missionaries in northern Germany as they work together to reach Europeans and immigrants. In the multi-cultural church plant started by this team, pray God would be glorified and many people will hear and believe the truth of Jesus.

27 DEAF PEOPLES. Africa is one of the fastest-growing continents in the world, and only a few IMB missionaries work among the Deaf there. Please pray specifically for the growth of IMB's Deaf team in Africa.

28 AMERICAN PEOPLES. "Most of our team has now moved to Cusco, Peru. We thank God for this! Please pray for peace and discernment as we settle in, seek Peruvian partners, and walk through doors the Father opens for us. Ask God to prepare hearts to hear and respond to His Word!"

29 NORTHERN AFRICAN AND MIDDLE EASTERN PEOPLES. Each day holds challenges for Margot and her family. She serves in Europe because she wants North African women to know and follow Jesus. It's hard to continue when most don't care to know about Jesus. Pray for perseverance and strength. Pray Ephesians 6:10-20 for her.

30 IMB MISSIONARIES. Pray for missionaries to have creative ideas and open doors for sharing the gospel with others.
