In the 1988 Olympics, the US had the fastest 400-meter relay team in the world. They were prohibitive favorites; they led the entire race until the last lap. They were ahead by ten meters and streaking to victory until the last handoff, when they fumbled the baton. They lost the race for one reason—nearing the finish line, they lost focus and fumbled the baton. The Bible is filled with cautionary tales of people who started well in the Lord, ran strong, and then...finished poorly. Solomon, Uzziah, Demas,

and the list goes on. Nearing what he thought might be his final days, Paul tells the Philippians, "I press on, that I may lay hold of that for which Christ Jesus has also laid hold of me... one thing I do, forgetting those things which are behind and reaching forward to those things which are ahead, I press toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus." Few things are as sad or disappointing as seeing a person who has run strong in the Lord lose focus, stumble, and finish poorly in their attitudes, words and actions. If you've started poorly, in Him you can still finish well. If you've been running well, by His grace and in His strength keep pressing toward the goal for which He laid hold of you. Don't lose focus and fumble the baton!

This coming Sunday morning we'll have a special guest in the service: Kari Osborne of Samaritan's Purse will be here to share a report and some wonderful stories from Operation Christmas Child and those shoebox gifts. On Sunday night we'll consider Mark 7: 24 – 30 and how even when the ride seems rough and uncomfortable, we can, and we need to, hold on to Jesus. 

Church Library Resource of the Week

What is a life of radical discipleship? At the root, it means we let Jesus set the agenda of our lives. We aren't selective, picking and choosing the congenial and avoiding the costly. No. He is Lord of all of life. In his final book, John Stott opens up what it means to truly be a follower of Jesus. In a refreshing and accessible style, he explores eight aspects of Christian discipleship which are too often neglected and yet deserve to be taken seriously: nonconformity, Christlikeness, maturity, creation care, simplicity, balance, dependence and death. Here, including the last public sermon he ever preached, Stott offers wisdom gained from a lifetime of consistent Christian commitment, and poignantly reflects on his last years of life and ministry. The message is simple, classic and personal: Jesus is Lord. He calls. We follow. Find it at 200 STO in the Church Library!
