Confined in prison, knowing that his final days were likely at hand, Paul urges Timothy to come before winter and to bring two things: his cloak and his books (II Tim. 4: 13). (What would you have asked for?) Exactly what those books were is a tantalizing mystery, but they almost certainly included Scripture—portions of the Old Testament, and perhaps what was to become part of the New Testament. Paul may have been at the end of life, but he was not yet done studying the Scripture.

Even in his final days, he still had a hunger for the Word of God and a longing to meet God and see His glory in the pages, or parchments, of His Word. During the trip to Turkey, I was reminded repeatedly that there is no end to the depth and power and wonder of the Word of the God, that there is always new insight to be gained and new application to be made. It's been said that that at the end of his life, Paul's desires were simple, because he had learned what was really important: he wanted the company of friends, he wanted to be warm, and he wanted his books—above all, the Scripture. Keep studying the Word of God, so you can experience the glory of the God of the Word. This winter, keep two things handy—your cloak and your Bible.

Meanwhile, back in Romans... this coming Sunday morning we'll get back to our study of the Book of Romans. We've reached Chapter 9, verses 14 - 33, where Paul continues to assure us that God and His Word can be trusted. In a world full of broken promises, manipulative leaders, and claims you cannot believe, God and His Word are absolutely trustworthy. On Sunday night, we'll take up our study of Mark and in chapter 10, verses 1-10, see how Jesus speaks to the question of divorce and remarriage. Be in worship this week – the Lord is worthy of it!




There's a covered dish lunch on the horizon, and you're invited!



Last week my dad had the honor of speaking at a few locations in Tennessee and needless to say, my mom and I were thrilled to join him. I can't tell you how refreshing it was to drive down streets painted with green landscapes, blue skies and churches...lots and lots of churches. How lovely to be greeted and surrounded by so many smiling faces and those openly living in the freedom and joy of their salvation. Coming from California and not yet 30 years old myself... what quickly became apparent to me was the hovering of the Holy Spirit in an area so saturated with fellow believers who welcome Him. His peace and presence in each room I entered was so thick, I could have cut it with a knife.
