We ask people to teach us what they're good at themselves. If you want to speak French, you look for a teacher who speaks French fluently. If you want to play the piano, throw a curveball, crochet an Afghan, or rebuild a transmission, then you look for a teacher who is good at doing that very thing. I've been playing golf once in a rare while since I was in junior high school, and I have never once had the person I played with ask me to give them golf lessons. We ask people to teach us what

they're good at themselves. Only one time in the Gospels do the disciples go to Jesus and ask Him to teach them something. He teaches them all through the course of His ministry, of course, but there is only one recorded instance when the disciples go to Him and ask, "Would you teach us how to do this?" Luke 11: 1: "Lord, teach us to... pray." At that point, Luke notes there that once again Jesus has been praying. The disciples see the importance that prayer has for Jesus and the impact it has on his life and ministry, and of all they might have thought to ask Jesus to teach them, what they ask is "Lord, teach us how to pray." We need to learn from the example Jesus gives the disciples and leaves for us, and pray. It's something you can learn to do, and do more effectively.

Few things stir the heart for missions like meeting and hearing from an IMB missionary, yet those opportunities can often be few and far between. In the last couple of years, we have been blessed to host PJ Scott, Phil and Laura Metcalf, Chris and Rebecca Abner, Angela Dawson, and now—Casey Jones and his family. The Joneses will be here this coming Sunday while they're on break from their work in East Germany, so don't miss the opportunity to be a part of another blessing! Plus we'll be baptizing several people who came to Christ in the revival services this week. In greater and more significant ways than we realize, money and possessions affect and influence our thinking, our priorities and choices. On Sunday night in Mark 10: 23 – 31, we see how Jesus declares that true wealth is spiritual, not material. You don't need to miss any of this!




